

#### Parish Membership

All new families and individuals are most welcome to our parish. We request that you register in the Rectory Office when you move into our community so that we can be of service to you. Our parish family invites all of its members to participate fully in our spiritual and social life. The priests and ministers are here to serve your needs, to share your joy, and to help lighten your burdens.

#### **Sacrament of Baptism**

Baptisms are celebrated on an individual basis. Please call the Rectory Office to schedule your Baptism. Baptism Prep classes are held either in-person or via Zoom.

#### **Sacrament of Matrimony**

The Sacrament is celebrated on Fridays: Time to be arranged. Saturdays: 12:00 Noon and 2:00 PM. Sundays: to be arranged. Arrangements must be made by a personal appointment with one of the priests or deacon.

Couples should make an appointment at least six months to a year in advance of the Wedding date. Nuptial Masses, as well as ceremonies, are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies are encouraged on Sunday.

#### **Marriage Preparation Program at OLM**

All engaged couples who plan to get married in the Catholic Church are required to complete a **Pre Cana Program**. Our program is offered twice a year. The Fall program meets once a week for 4 weeks: and the Spring program runs for an entire weekend. **FOCCUS**, a Communication study, is administered twice a year and is required for all couples.

#### Pre Cana and FOCCUS

The goal of the Pre Cana program is to strengthen the vocation of marriage and foster a deeper understanding of marriage as a sacrament by supporting couples throughout their married life.



#### FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. JOHN D. McCARTHY

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of Mercy Family,

Greetings and Peace of the Lord be with you!

As we continue our Lenten pilgrimage together and navigate through these challenging times, yet we are a people filled with hope and encouragement to know that our all-loving and all-merciful God is in the eye of every storm we face in life. It seems we are living in an age of freedom with laws thrown to the wind and too many people deciding what is right and wrong on their own; we are correct in asking the question of what happened to the Ten Commandments. Do they really matter anymore or are they a bit old fashioned? The giving of the commandments to Moses on Mount Sinai signaled the birth of Israel as a nation. For the Jewish people, obeying the commandments was seen as an encounter to build a healthy and deeper relationship with a real personal God. Our society is obviously more advanced and sophisticated than was Israel at the time of Moses, but right and wrong is still the same, it hasn't changed. The Ten Commandments are the very roots of our faith. Perhaps during this Lenten season would be a good opportunity for us to refocus on these eternal laws from God. They are the bricks and mortar; the very foundation of a stable society where we can find true peace, good order and freedom.

In clearing of the Temple, Jesus shows great reverence in today's Gospel message for the House of God and leaves us an example of how we should respect our own places of worship. We should look upon these spaces as sanctuaries of genuine prayer. The Temple in Jesus' time turned into a noisy market place of buyers and sellers who were guilty of using the Lord's dwelling for their own selfish gains. All the commotion caused showed little or no regard for the true value of worship and respect. We see Jesus reasserting fierce reverence for God's holy name and for His house of prayer available for all people of every nation.

As a faith community we gather each Sunday to celebrate the sacred Eucharist and to thank God in prayer for the past week's events, as well as ask for His grace for the week ahead. Every time we gather around the Lord's sacrificial Altar should be like a step on the way up to Heaven, but is it? Are we closer to God by being here at Holy Mass or has our Sunday worship degenerated into an empty ritual or something we do because it's expected of us? The Sabbath should make us truly appreciate the God above us, the world He has given us, and all the people around us. God's true desire is for us to worship Him with more than words and external behavior. Worship virtually means saying to God; 'How great thou art." It's our response when we recognize the goodness of God in our own lives and share His goodness and love with our neighbor. Worship and the way we live as Christian people are not meant to be cut off from one another; hence, we are called to be the Church in our society during the week as we strive each day to be a "living sacrament" of God's life and love to one another.

"Lent is about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving – know this, this extraordinary moment is an act of charity." May Jesus, our Divine Physician, heal us of every illness and affliction; and in His great mercy forgive us, watch over us, and save us; and may our Blessed Mother Mary, Our Lady of Mercy, keep us always under the mantle of her love, care and protection into eternity.




#### March 10 - Fourth Sunday of Lent:

#### **INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY, MARCH 8**

**St. Teresa of Ávila-** (born March 28, 1515, Ávila, Spain—died October 4, 1582, Alba de Tormes; canonized 1622; feast day October 15) Spanish nun, one of the great mystics and religious women of the Roman Catholic Church, and author of spiritual classics. She was the originator of the Carmelite Reform, which restored and emphasized the austerity and contemplative character of primitive Carmelite life. St. Teresa was elevated to doctor of the church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI, the first woman to be so honoured.

**St. Edith Stein-** (born October 12, 1891, Breslau, Germany [now Wrocław, Poland]—died August 9/10, 1942, Auschwitz concentration camp; canonized October 11, 1998; feast day August 9), Roman Catholic convert from Judaism, Carmelite nun, philosopher, and spiritual writer who was executed by the Nazis because of her Jewish ancestry and who is regarded as a modern martyr. She was declared a saint by the Roman Catholic Church in 1998.

**St. Theresa of Lisieux**- (born January 2, 1873, Alençon, France—died September 30, 1897, Lisieux; canonized May 17, 1925; feast day October 1) Carmelite nun whose service to her Roman Catholic order, although outwardly unremarkable, was later recognized for its exemplary spiritual accomplishments. She was named a doctor of the church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. She is a patron saint of missions and of florists.

**St. Katharine Drexel-** (born November 26, 1858, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, U.S.—died March 3, 1955, Cornwells Heights; feast day [U.S.] March 3) was the American founder of the Blessed Sacrament Sisters for Indians and Colored People (now Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament), a congregation of missionary nuns dedicated to the welfare of American Indians and African Americans. She is the patron saint of racial justice and of philanthropists.

**St. Teresa of Calcutta-** Teresa (baptized August 27, 1910, Skopje, Macedonia, Ottoman Empire [now in Republic of North Macedonia]—died September 5, 1997, Calcutta [now Kolkata], India; canonized September 4, 2016; feast day September 5) founder of the Order of the Missionaries of Charity, a Roman Catholic congregation of women dedicated to the poor, particularly to the destitute of India. She was the recipient of numerous honours, including the 1979 Nobel Prize for Peace.

God's Word remains the standard for anyone's view of women through the ages and can not present a system of higher regard for women than Scripture, no matter what the culture says or believes.


