

Sacrament of Baptism

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament is celebrated on Fridays: Time to be arranged. Saturdays: 12:00 Noon and 2:00 PM. Sundays: to be arranged. Arrangements must be made by a personal appointment with one of the priests or deacon.

Couples should make an appointment at least six months to a year in advance of the Wedding date. Nuptial Masses, as well as ceremonies, are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies are encouraged on Sunday.

Marriage Preparation Program at OLM

All engaged couples who plan to get married in the Catholic Church are required to complete a **Pre Cana Program**. Our program is offered twice a year. The Fall program meets once a week for 4 weeks: and the Spring program runs for an entire weekend. **FOCCUS**, a Communication study, is administered twice a year and is required for all couples.

Pre Cana and FOCCUS

The goal of the Pre Cana program is to strengthen the vocation of marriage and foster a deeper understanding of marriage as a sacrament by supporting couples throughout their married life.

A LETTER FROM FR. JOSEPH J. NIXON

Dear Parishioners, Good Shepherd Sunday April 21, 2024

"He is Risen, as He said! Alleluia!!!"

Weldon Keller's book <u>A Shepherd Looks at Psalms 23</u> [Zondervan Publishing, 1997] gives some very interesting insights into the habits of a flock sheep of that can be compared to Jesus' role as the Good Shepherd.

- 1. Sheep depend on the shepherd for their wellbeing.
- 2. Sheep are social animals that travel together in a large flock but not too close together; they like their personal space.
- 3. Sometimes sheep lose their connection to the flock and tend to stray which can lead to disaster.
- 4. Often sheep are unaware of the dangers of the world. In spring, just before sheering, when the streams and rivers are full and running deep the shepherd must keep the sheep away from swiftly moving water. Otherwise, the sheep, in their thirst, will wade out into the swiftly moving water and with their thick wool coats absorb too much water they will fall over and drown.
- 5. The sheep learn the sound of the voice of their shepherd so that when he calls to them, they will come to him, but they will run from the voice of a stranger.

Today, we celebrate World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Please pray that those who are being called to a vocation within the Church...to marriage, as a religious sister or brother, as a deacon or priest, or as a single person...will be generous ins saying "yes" to the Lord's call. Also, if you know someone who "has the makings" please encourage them to consider taking the next step.

Beginning on Mother's Day (Sunday, May 12) and continuing for 9 days, we will remember our Mothers, living and deceased, at Masses each day.

We will soon have the great joy of welcoming another group of our younger parishioners to the table of the Lord, as they receive their *First Holy Communion.* This is a special day for them, their families...and for our parish! Receiving Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time means that they can now join us at the altar every week. Let us pray that their parents will be faithful in bringing them to Mass each weekend, so we can all celebrate our membership in the Body of Christ. **Fr. Joe**



Visibly shaken and soaking wet, Marco led Lisa* into our office and introduced her to Juana, who spoke Spanish and immediately welcomed her with compassion, making Lisa feel comfortable, secure and accepted. Marco knew well that Lisa was now in excellent hands and offered her rosary beads before leaving. Lisa immediately understood that there would be no judgement passed upon her. She willingly began to share her turbulent past and unfortunate events that led her to this very moment. Finally, someone was sincerely interested in her and her feelings.

Most recently, Lisa had been separated from her abusive husband, with whom she had a five-year-old daughter. Although Lisa had begun seeing another man, her husband continued to contact her and encouraged her to meet with him. Against her better judgement, she agreed. Lisa was unaware of the evil intent her husband had in mind for their meeting. This was a night that would forever change her life. Sadly, Lisa endured a considerable amount of violence, abuse, and manipulation which resulted in a horrific attack resulting in rape.

Lisa became pregnant. Filled with panic and terror, Lisa made several different attempts to abort her pregnancy. She purchased the morning after pill, drank a rare tea that she heard would induce abortion, and went to a doctor who referred her for a surgical abortion at Planned Parenthood. However, the huge expense was not something she could afford. By the Grace of God, she encountered Marco and he led her to the Life Center. Juana told her the baby was a gift from God despite her husband's despicable actions. Her focus now should be on her sweet 5-year-old daughter who would now have a sibling. Juana pointed out that Lisa had already been managing on her own with one child, and that the risks and ramifications of abortion would be more traumatic than the rape. Lisa learned about the grief and depression that often continues for years, even decades, following an abortion, and how alcohol, drug abuse and even suicide rates increase dramatically for women who have an abortion.

Juana asked Lisa to watch a new endoscopic video together about gestational development called "See Baby Grow". With the education and support provided, Lisa agreed to an ultrasound and saw the miracle of her 11-week-old baby moving around in her womb. In that moment, Lisa knew she would keep her child, and thanked God that her abortion attempts had failed. "This baby is going to be special," says Marco. "Just think, four attempts to end the life of this child... the morning after pill, some strange tea, going to a doctor that she thought could do an abortion, and then to Planned Parenthood."

Through the storm, by God's grace, came the rainbow.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We know that the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy can seem insurmountable. This is especially true when it feels like there is no support for a pregnant woman struggling to appreciate the precious gift of life she carries and may compel her towards a regrettable decision. But genuine empowerment of women comes only through recognizing the dignity of the human person at every stage of life and this is most poignantly illuminated through the blessings of motherhood.

In this, it is with great joy that I announce the **FIAT Pregnancy Support Program** at Catholic Health. This program, in partnership with the Diocese of Rockville Centre, comprises a dedicated help line designed to assist women access the **counsel**, **resources**, **and encouragement needed to choose life** when facing a pregnancy with unexpected or difficult circumstances. **The Pregnancy Support Team is available 24x7**, **365 days of the year** to assist callers in accessing the services needed to help them see that every new life is a blessing, even when there are challenges.

Any expectant woman in need of help can call the FIAT Pregnancy Support Program and be confident that, regardless of age, religion, immigration status or ability to pay, she will receive compassionate, non-judgmental, and *life-affirming* care. Most of all, she can be assured that she will not be alone through her pregnancy, and she will not be abandoned after she delivers her child. If she is overwhelmed by an unexpected pregnancy, contemplating abortion pills on her college campus, distressed with an adverse prenatal diagnosis, experiencing a miscarriage, worried about feeding her child, regretting a past abortion or other pregnancy-related distress, FIAT is there to help her sort things out and get the care she needs. It only takes the courage of a phone call to find real hope: 631-476-LOVE (5683).

It is my prayer that the **FIAT Pregnancy Support Program** be recognized across the Diocese of Rockville Centre as the first step a woman takes when facing challenging circumstances during pregnancy. There are promotional materials available at every parish and on-line, but we ask for your help to make this resource known widely through your prayers, your witness, and your word-of-mouth, for every one of us has an important and serious responsibility to spread the Gospel of Life. Let FIAT lead the way.


