



From Fear to Faith: Encountering the Risen Christ

Dear OLM Family Members,

The Gospel of **John 20:19-31**, presents one of the most powerful post-resurrection appearances of Jesus. The disciples are gathered behind locked doors, paralyzed by fear, when suddenly, Jesus stands among them and says, "**Peace be with you**" (John 20:19). This moment transforms them from frightened followers into bold witnesses. Yet, one disciple, Thomas, is absent and refuses to believe until he sees and touches Jesus himself. A week later, Jesus appears again, inviting Thomas to put his hands in His wounds, leading to Thomas' profound declaration: "**My Lord and my God!**" (John 20:28).

This passage, often known for "Doubting Thomas," is much more than a lesson about belief. It is about how Jesus meets us in our fear, doubt, and weakness, offering us His peace and the invitation to trust Him. This theme is echoed in Acts 5:12-16, where the once-fearful disciples now boldly proclaim the Gospel, and in Revelation 1:9-19, where the Risen Christ appears in glory to John, dispelling fear with His divine presence.

How often do we find ourselves locked in fear—fear of the unknown, fear of failure, fear of suffering? Jesus' first gift to His disciples is not a plan of action, but peace. He does the same for us. He enters the locked doors of our hearts, offering the peace that the world cannot give. But we must allow Him in.

Jesus doesn't just bring peace—He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples, empowering them for mission: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21-22). The once-timid disciples become courageous messengers of the Gospel, as seen in Acts 5:12-16. No longer hiding, they now heal the sick and boldly proclaim Christ, despite opposition.

This is the transformative power of the Holy Spirit. We, too, are called to move from fear to mission. The world needs witnesses of Christ's mercy, and we are sent, just as the first disciples were.

Thomas was absent when Jesus first appeared. Perhaps he was grieving alone, struggling to process everything that had happened. When told of the resurrection, he refuses to believe without physical proof. A week later, Jesus meets Thomas in his doubt, inviting him to touch His wounds. Thomas responds with the greatest profession of faith: "My Lord and my God!"

Thomas represents all of us in moments of doubt. Sometimes, faith feels difficult, and we struggle to trust in Christ's presence. But notice that Jesus does not reject Thomas—He meets him where he is and gently invites him deeper into faith. Jesus does the same with us, revealing Himself in ways that strengthen our belief.

The same Risen Christ who appeared to the disciples also appears to John in Revelation 1:9-19. John, now in exile, sees Jesus in His full glory—His face shining like the sun, His voice like rushing waters. Overwhelmed, John falls at His feet, but Jesus reassures him: "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. I was dead, and now look; I am alive forever and ever!" (Revelation 1:17-18).

Jesus' victory over death is not just a past event—it is an eternal reality. He reigns in power and walks among His people. His words to John remind us that no matter what trials we face, He is with us.

When you feel overwhelmed, meditate on Jesus' words: "Do not be afraid." Trust in His victory and presence in your life.

Jesus tells Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe" (John 20:29). This blessing extends to all of us. Unlike the first disciples, we do not see Jesus physically, but we encounter Him in the Eucharist, in Scripture, in the love of others, and in the quiet stirrings of our hearts. Faith is not about having all the answers—it is about trusting in the One who is faithful.

The journey from fear to faith is one we all walk. Like the disciples, we may struggle with fear. Like Thomas, we may wrestle with doubt. But Jesus meets us where we are, offering His peace, His Spirit, and His presence. He calls us to trust in Him, to be transformed by His love, and to go forth as witnesses to the world.

As we continue through the Easter season, let us open our hearts to the Risen Christ. Let us allow **His peace to replace our fears, His Spirit to empower our mission, and His love to deepen our faith**. And may we, like Thomas, proclaim with conviction: "My Lord and my God."






