

Couples should make an appointment at least six months to a year in advance of the Wedding date. Nuptial Masses, as well as ceremonies, are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies are encouraged on Sunday.

Program.

Dear Parishioners,

"He is Risen, as He said! Alleluia!!!"

On Saturday (May 10), some of our younger children celebrated their First Holy Communion. All the Sacraments and all the ministries of the church flow toward and around the Eucharist. Please pray for our young parishioners and their families - that they will make the choice to come each week to receive Jesus at the table of the Lord. On May 13 we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with some of our older students. We all are called to be open to God's Spirit. Let us use the gifts of the Spirit...wisdom, knowledge, right judgment, courage, understanding, reverence and wonder & awe in God's presence; the gifts Confirmation brings, as we strive to witness to God, the true source of our joy, goodness and strength.

SACRED ART

Sacred art is true and beautiful when its form corresponds to its particular vocation: evoking and glorifying, in faith and adoration, the transcendent mystery of God—the surpassing invisible beauty of truth and love visible in Christ, who "reflects the glory of God and bears the very stamp of his nature," in whom "the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily." This spiritual beauty of God is reflected in the most holy Virgin Mother of God, the angels, and saints. Genuine sacred art draws man to adoration, to prayer, and to the love of God, Creator and Savior, the Holy One and Sanctifier."

Visio Divina- Divine Seeing

The Ascension of Christ Visio Divina: Praying With Art

So when the apostles were with Jesus, they kept asking him, "Lord, has the time come for you to free Israel and restore our kingdom?"

He replied, "The Father alone has the authority to set those dates and times, and they are not for you to know. 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

After saying this, he was taken up into a cloud while they were watching, and they could no longer see him. As they strained to see him rising into heaven, two white-robed men suddenly stood among them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why are you standing here staring into heaven? Jesus has been taken from you into heaven, but someday he will return from heaven in the same way you saw him go!"

-Acts 1:6-11

Visio Divina, Latin for "divine seeing." It is simply the practice of incorporating seeing a work of art in prayer. Here we use our sense of sight and imagination while in prayerful contemplation. We can have a real spiritual encounter on how we see the beauty, truth and goodness in the world around us and grow in close relationship with God.

5 Steps to the Practice of Visio Divina:

Visio: Looking at the image

Meditatio: Being attentive to God's Word

Oratio: Praying from the heart

Contemplatio: Resting in God's presence Actio: Asking God how to live out this prayer
